#### **CALL MEETING TO ORDER**

President Kyle Hoegemeyer called the Regular Meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and announced that a quorum was present and that notice of the meeting had been posted for the time and manner required by law.

contract and authorize our Board President to file a written complaint to the State Board for Educator Certification. Motion carried unanimously

Executive Director of Athletics and Fine Arts, Jason Glenn, shared that Willis ISD has amazing coaches and kids being honored at this meeting.

Volleyball Awards – Director Glenn introduced Willis High School Volleyball Coach Megan Storms sharing that she is a great coach and an amazing person. Coach Storms thanked Dr. Harkrider, Administration, the Board of Trustees, Director Glenn and Principal Smith for their support. Coach Storms shared that Volleyball had an awesome season and that she is very proud of the girls standing before them today; their awesome performance on the court and their performance in the classroom as leaders.

Football Awards – Willis High School Head Football Coach Trent Miller, who Director Glenn introduced as a leader of young men and someone who has had a real impact with the kids and the community, recognized football athletes. Coach Miller thanked the Board, Dr. Harkrider and

the community members for all their support and for trusting and believing in what the coaches do to help the young men of Willis High School grow.

Board President Kyle Hoegemeyer extended Congratulations to all students who were recognized.

Willis ISD Director of Communications, Jamie Fails, shared a video highlighting Parent Involvement throughout the District.

## STANDING INFORMATION AND AD HOC REPORTS & ITEMS

Community Involvement Liaison, Michelle Bischof, and Willis ISD Education Foundation members presented a check to Willis ISD for \$74,944.30 awarded to Willis ISD teachers through the Foundation's grant program.

Superintendent Harkrider shared that he had met with Durotech, Inc. earlier in the day and they gave him a \$10,000 check to present to the Willis ISD Education Foundation. Durotech Construction Foundation matches funds that their vendors donate to be given to organizations such as the Willis ISD Education Foundation. Ms. Bischof and the Foundation Members present were excited to receive this donation.

Lieutenant Leslee Zemlicka, Director of Willis ISD Security, presented an update on safety and security measures at all campuses and throughout the District, regarding audits at each campus. State audits at Roark Early Childhood Center, Lagway Elementary and Brabham Middle School were reported as one hundred percent in compliance.

Superintendent Harkrider reviewed the Safety Performance Report for November 2022; three accidents, two employees with loss time injuries and no employees on workers comp.

There were no questions concerning the financial reports and bill payment report.

Superintendent Harkrider reported the student attendance on December 12, 2022 was 8,792 students which is up about 283 students from this time last year.

There were no questions concerning the 2022 Bond Projects Summary and information regarding the 2020 and 2015 Bond Issue funds.

Motion by Cliff Williams and seconded by Chad Jones to approve the Consent Agenda items as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Cliff Williams and seconded by Scott Carson to accept the Superintendent's recommendation to approve and sign the Management Safety Statement. Motion carried unanimously.

# DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS

Executive Director of Student Services, Brad Mansfield, discussed the Willis ISD 2023-2024 Course Catalog: High School, Middle School and Elementary. Mr. Mansfield requested to add the following courses to the 2023-2024 WISD Course Catalog: Animation II, Practicum in Early Learning, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Advanced Orchestra, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Intermediate Orchestra, Art Appreciation, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Technical Theatre I, Government DC, and Middle School Principles of Arts, Audio/Video Technology and Communications as recommended by Superintendent Harkrider.

Motion by Scott Carson and seconded by Paulett Traylor to accept the Superintendent's recommendation to approve the 2023-2024 Willis ISD Course Catalog including the above requested courses. Motion carried unanimously.

Director of Career and Technology, Travis Utecht, discussed the out of state travel request for Advanced Culinary Arts to attend the Culinary Institute of America in New York. Superintendent Harkrider recommended this out of state trip.

Motion by Chad Jones and seconded by Paulett Traylor to accept the Superintendent's recommendation and approve the out of state travel for the Culinary Arts Program. Motion carried unanimously.

Executive Director of Support Services and Construction, Paul Dusebout, discussed the need of Willis High School's Air Handler Unit Replacement Phase I Installation. Dr. Harkrider recommended approval of this project with a total cost of \$2,242,529.00 to be paid from 2020 Bond Issue Funds and done through Kim Neal & Associates, LLC, a Texas Interlocal Purchasing System Awarded Vendor.

Motion by Paulett Traylor and seconded by Scott Carson that the Board accept the Superintendent's recommendation to expend \$2,242,529.00, from 2020 Bond Issue Funds, for the Phase I Installation Replacement of the air handler units at Willis High School. Motion carried unanimously.

Executive Director Paul Dusebout discussed the need of the A.R. Turner Elementary Chiller and Boiler Plant Replacement. Dr. Harkrider recommended this project with a total cost of \$2,294,671.00 to be paid from 2020 Bond Issue Funds and done through Kim Neal & Associates, LLC.

Motion by Scott Carson and seconded by Chad Jones that the Board accept the Superintendent's recommendation to expend \$2,294,671.00 from 2020 Bond Issue Funds, for the replacement of the chiller and boiler plant at A.R. Turner Elementary, Bond 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

Executive Director Dusebout discussed the need of Lynn Lucas Middle School's Auditorium Air Handler Unit Replacement. Dr. Harkrider recommended this project with a total cost of \$743,104.00 to be paid from 2020 Bond Issue Funds and done through Kim Neal & Associates, LLC.

Motion by Chad Jones and seconded by Scott Carson that the Board accept the Superintendent's recommendation to expend \$743,104.00 from 2020 Bond Issue Funds, for the replacement of the air handler units at Lynn Lucas Middle School Auditorium. Motion carried unanimously.

Executive Director Dusebout discussed the Meador Elementary Chiller Replacement Project. Dr. Harkrider recommended this project with a total cost of \$1,580,230.00 to be paid from 2020 Bond Issue Funds and done through Kim Neal & Associates, LLC, in 2023.

Motion by Cliff Williams and seconded by Paulett Traylor that the Board accept the Superintendent's recommendation to expend \$1,580,230.00 from 2020 Bond Issue funds, for the installation of the mechanical/electrical equipment needed for the Meador Elementary Project, Bond 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

Director Dusebout discussed a purchase over \$50,000 for upgraded bus camera systems. These systems will enhance security on the buses. Superintendent Harkrider recommended this purchase sharing that Willis ISD is receiving a 10% discount to purchase in 2022 and a savings of \$47,000 for the Willis ISD Maintenance Department installing the systems.

Motion by Scott Carson and seconded by Nikita Lagway that the Board accept the Superintendent's recommendation to approve the purchase from Safety Vision in the amount of \$94,134.96. Motion carried unanimously.

Director of Child Nutrition, Michael Northey, discussed the bid related to Request for Proposal (RFP) # 110122, the Serving Line at Lynn Lucas Middle School. Superintendent, Dr. Tim Harkrider, recommended awarding this bid to Kommercial Kitchen with a total purchase cost of \$223,259.00 from the Child Nutrition Budget.

Board Member Chad Jones asked that Superintendent Harkrider discuss this purchase and the way the Child Nutrition Budget operates. Dr. Harkrider shared that the Willis ISD Child Nutrition Department operates on their own budget and that the free lunches that were approved by the government last school year enabled the Department to acquire additional funds. Federal guidelines are to be followed when spending those funds and can only be utilized by the Child Nutrition Department. Thus, upgrades and new equipment for the kitchens and cafeterias will be possible for the Child Nutrition Department.

Motion by Scott Carson and seconded by Paulett Traylor to accept the Superintendent's recommendation to award the bid related to RFP 110122 to Kommercial Kitchen and approve the purchase of \$223,259.00 from the Child Nutrition Budget. Motion carried unanimously.

## **BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS**

Board Member Chad Jones expressed what a great night it had been to witness this hard working group of people and the awesome amount of grants that were given. Mr. Jones shared that he agreed with Ms. Hivnor that we all need to come together.

Board Member Scott Carson congratulated Coach Trent Miller and the football boys. Mr. Carson stressed that we do need to come together. He also shared that it was an honor to be a part of Willis ISD and all the positive morale that he saw as he helped serve lunch to the Willis High School staff earlier this week.

Board Member Nikita Lagway shared that she was so proud to be a part of this Board of Trustees. Ms. Lagway expressed how excited she was to see progress and accomplishments made by Principal, Dr. Shukella Price, at Brabham Middle School, Principal, Eric Burns, at Lucas Middle School and Principal, Chad Smith, at Willis High School. She stressed her appreciation for all the positive things they are doing.
